


PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Group Counseling

Education Alternatives schools are 100% academic and 100% therapeutic. As part of our mission and promise, we offer daily mental health services in the form of group and individual counseling to all students. Our mental health staff work together with the classroom staff to give space to the students to share with one another, learn coping skills, explore their strengths and struggles, and give each other feedback and support.

The challenges of 2020 impacted children in many ways - from stress at home to worries about family members' health and more. By committing to providing individualized academic services in a therapeutic environment. in partnership with our sister organization REACH Behavioral Health, EA gives students a place to learn, grow and heal. The skills that students learn in our Day Treatment program help them to stay emotionally regulated so that they can learn academically.


